# Letter from the Head Teacher

Dear Parents and Carers,

We draw a close to the end of a highly productive and eventful term. Our renewed focus on creating a culture of celebration at Toot Hill has placed community engagement at its core, with dramatically increased opportunities for face-to-face interactions with school. In addition, we finally received our first Ofsted inspection since December 2011.

We have now reached a time when our expectations and standards are no different to those before the pandemic and if anything, they are higher. This has been secured by 'narrating the positive' to create exceptional social norms within our school within a culture of celebration. Students are recognised for their efforts and excellence in a plethora of ways, such as Achievement Assemblies, credits, awards for accumulation of credits, verbal praise in and out of lessons, Achievement Evening and 'Hot Chocolate with the Head'.

## **NACE Challenge Award**

Earlier this term, we were awarded with the NACE Challenge Award for the fourth time. Furthermore, we are the first school in the country to be awarded Ambassador status! This is a huge achievement recognizing our learning provision for the most able of learners. However, the award also recognizes that providing for More Able learners is about creating a curriculum which gives opportunities for all children to flourish.

Everyone should be very proud of their part in securing this award. The assessor's feedback stated that the culture of the school was central to her decision and we all play our part in setting this culture. Specific thanks go to all the teachers and students involved in the assessment day. The fantastic lessons visited were truly representative of our More Able provision on a day-to-day basis.

### Parent/Carer Partnership

Communication with you is central to school improvement and we recognise that there is still much to build on in this area. Face-to-face information evenings, in-school parents' evenings, increased parent/carer meetings, Achievement Evening and Parent Forum meetings are now all regular features of our calendar. However, an increased number of positive phone calls from staff to home is also fundamental to a stronger working partnership, as is a focus on improving the quality of all written communication home to ensure it is positive, accurately conveying the ethos of our school.

Next term, we will be seeking your views about how we can improve our communication with you. As ever, your voice is crucial to improving our school. I summarise below some key changes made this term as a result of parent/carer voice:
