Part A:

What do I need to do before September?

Reminder: What are the Toot Hill College Entry Requirements?

As discussed at interview, and as included in pages 18-19 of our Toot Hill College prospectus, Toot Hill College has the following entry requirements for all students intending to begin studying with us in Year 12.

General Entry Requirements:

All students who wish to study at Toot Hill College must achieve a grade 5 or above in English Language and Maths GCSEs, and at least 2 B (or 6) grades and 3 C (or 5) grades overall (including English Language and Maths).

Course-Specific Entry Requirements:

In addition to the general entry requirements, there are also course-specific entry requirements for each course that need to be met in order for a student to be able to enrol on that course. The course entry requirements for next year are included for you below:

1. How do I enrol in order to take up my place in September?

- All students wishing to take up their place in September 2017 must enrol online.
- In order to enrol online, students must complete the online Toot Hill College enrolment form for Year 12 by visiting the following link:

www.toothillschool.co.uk/enrol

- Enrolment for students beginning Year 12 in September 2017 will **open** on Thursday 24th August 2017 (GCSE Results Day).
- Enrolment for students beginning Year 12 in September 2017 will <u>close</u> on Thursday 31st August 2017.
- The first day of Autumn Term for all Year 12 students will be Monday 4th September 2017.
- Students will only be able to enrol if they meet the general College entry requirements, and the course-specific entry requirements for the courses they have chosen to study (see above).

In order to complete the online enrolment form, students will need:

 IMPORTANT: You will need to recall the email address you submitted with your application to Toot Hill College.

This is the email you have received correspondence on since applying and being offered a place.

You need this because a secure link will be sent to this email address during the enrolment process. This is necessary to ensure that all personal data is sufficiently protected and confidential.

If for any reason you cannot recall the email address, visit the same link and there are instructions there regarding next steps.

- 2. Your full set of GCSE Results what you achieved in each course.
- 3. Parent contact information including:
- Address and postcode
- Home telephone number
- Parent mobile number
- Parent email address

2. What if I don't meet the general College entry requirements?

If you do not secure the general College entry requirements of:

- A 5 or above in English Language GCSE
- A 5 or above in Mathematic GCSE
- At least two B (or 6) Grades and three C (or 5) Grades (including English Language and Maths)

then unfortunately we will not be able to enrol you at Toot Hill College.

All applicants this year are welcome to re-apply next academic year, if they are able to arrange resitting any relevant GCSE qualifications to meet our entry requirements.

Please note that if you are an <u>internal</u> applicant from Toot Hill School lower school, then you will be able to arrange an appointment with the lower school destinations adviser Ms. Farmer, who will be able to offer you further support and guidance on the options available to you going forward. Appointments with Ms. Farmer can be booked through the same link: <u>www.toothillschool.co.uk/enrol</u> and will take place Wednesday 30th August – Friday 1st September 2017.

3. What if I meet the general College entry requirements, but not the course-specific ones for the courses I have chosen?

If you secured the general College entry requirements (see above) but not the coursespecific entry requirements for the three courses you have chosen to study then:

- You will still be able to take up a place to study at Toot Hill College
- But you will not be able to take up a place to study on any course for which you have not met the course-specific entry requirements.

You will be able to enrol onto a different course only if:

- 1. You have met the course-specific entry requirements for this new course.
- 2. There are available spaces on the new course.

In order to enrol onto different courses you must:

- Visit www.toothillschool.co.uk/enrol
- Select the appropriate answers to the questions, where you will be directed to an appointments system.
- Book an appointment with a member of the College Team to discuss and decide an appropriate change of courses.

4. What if I meet both the general College entry requirements, and the course-specific ones for the courses I have chosen, but wish to change courses anyway?

If you achieve both the general College entry requirements and the course-specific entry requirements but wish to change courses, you will need to:

- 1. Wait until the first day of Autumn Term Monday 4th September 2017.
- 2. Then visit the College Reception and pick up an 'Application to change courses' form.
- 3. Complete this form and hand it back into the College Reception.

Please note that while we will do our best to accommodate any application to change courses, submitting an application to change courses is not a guarantee that this will happen. The application will be considered and approved only if:

- a) The student has met the course-specific entry requirements on the new course they wish to change onto.
- b) There are available spaces on the new course the student wishes to change onto.

5. Summer tasks:

All Year 12 students beginning Toot Hill College in September 2017 are expected to complete a summer task for each of the courses they are studying next year.

It is essential that students complete the relevant course tasks in order to give them a firm grounding in this course from the beginning. Moreover, the summer tasks have been designed to illustrate the type of learning expected at a College level; in particular, students will be expected to work more independently when studying their A Levels and the summer task sets the precedent for this.

Paper copies of the summer tasks were handed out during the College Induction taster lessons. Electronic copies of these summer tasks can also be found on the Toot Hill College website, following these instructions:

- Click the 'College Noticeboard' tab
- Click on the 'Induction Day's tab
- Click on the section labelled 'Summer tasks'

If students change their intended course options, they are expected to download the relevant summer task and ensure this is completed by the beginning of term.

Toot Hill College Dress Code:

At Toot Hill College we have a professional dress code for our learners, which has been designed to reflect the values of hard work and professionalism we instil in all our students.

The dress code requires students to attend College in smart/casual clothing, which excludes denim, trainers, t-shirts, shorts, low-cut tops, leggings and sports wear.

Toot Hill College ID Badges:

In order to ensure that all students are safe on site, all students and members of staff are assigned ID badges at the beginning of each year in September. These ID badges must be worn by students and staff at all times.

Toot Hill College Attendance and Absence Procedure:

All students at Toot Hill College are expected to attend morning registration every day, and all their timetabled subject and private study lessons. Attendance to all sessions is crucial for ensuring that your child achieves their full potential while with us. In the case of unavoidable absence, we have a strict attendance and absence procedure:

Absences known about in advance:

For unavoidable absences known about in advance, students must collect a 'Leave of absence' form from the College Reception desk, which must be discussed with, authorised and signed by a member of the College Leadership Team and a parent, before being returned to the College Secretary.

Absences on the day:

If your child is too ill in the morning to attend College on that day, please ring and speak to the College Secretary on 01949 863072 or leave a message. Alternatively, you can email the reason for your child's absence to college.admin@toothillschool.co.uk

If your child falls ill during the day at College, they will need to speak to a member of the College Leadership Team who will authorise their absence for the remainder of the day.

Toot Hill College Passport:

What do a normal timetabled day and week look like?

• Please note that on a Friday, College – as per the lower school – ends at 2.10pm, at the end of Period 7.

In a normal timetabled week, of a possible 38 periods, your child will have the following timetabled sessions:

- 6 periods for each of the three courses they are studying.
- 1 period for the weekly compulsory mentor period.
- 12 periods of timetabled private study, during which students must sign in and complete independent study in the College study rooms.

With their remaining time, all students are encouraged to participate in the wide range of extracurricular activities available at Toot Hill College.
